Community Group Leaders Guide

Week of October 16 Jeremiah 18:1-12

Today's big idea: God redeems us.

God redeems us. We redeem coupons. Coupons make good deals. I know it's a stretch but just have fun with it.

- What is the best deal you ever got on something you bought?
- List out the Community Group Guidelines as a group. Start with the one you always forget.

Bible Study

- Someone pray that God would help us hear from him.
- Use the Bible Storytelling technique to tell the story of Jeremiah at the potter's house.
- Retell the story together as a group.
- Read the story from Jeremiah 18:1-12 in the Bible.

There are a few theological questions here. Don't feel like you have to correct everything that is said. That may squelch involvement in the future. Instead, say things like, "Thank you for sharing. Where did you learn that?" Clean up heresy regarding primary theological tenants but otherwise just follow up outside of the group.

- Jeremiah was sent to an actual potter with actual clay. How does that impact your understanding of what God was communicating?
- Who is in control of the outcomes according to this story? Why?
- Is God mean, loving, or something else?
- How do you feel about God changing his mind?

As We Go

Try not to spend too much time on the first question here. Be ready to share on question two below. Remember, transparency and vulnerability will be replicated if you show it.

- To be clear, not every hard time in our lives is a punishment from God. What else could cause hard times in our lives?
- How have you experienced the punishment of God for sin in your life?
- How have you experienced the redemption of God from repentance in your life? And what is repentance anyway?
- Is there something you need to repent for now? As you close in prayer start with a quiet time and pray silently for the repentance.

Be sure to follow up with each group member the day after you meet and simply ask if they repented of anything. If they did they may not want to share what it was but encourage them for taking the step of faith. If they didn't ask if there was anything holding them back.

Community Group Coach Covenant

- I will pray for my assigned Community Group Leaders daily.
- I will relationally disciple someone.
