Can I Trust...?

Luke 4:16-30 /// Week of October 8

Today's big idea: We can trust Jesus. Have fun with the icebreaker.

- Talk about an experience you had at a reunion (family, high school, etc.) or talk about why you avoid them.
- Review the Community Group Guidelines together.
- Someone pray that God would help us hear from him.

Head

This is a great story for Bible Storytelling.

- Use the Bible Storytelling technique to tell the story of Jesus in his hometown.
- Retell the story together as a group.
- Read the story from Luke 4:16-30 in the Bible.
- What do we learn here about Jesus?
- What do we learn about the people of Nazareth?
- What made it hard for the people to trust Jesus?

Heart

These questions get progressively more intense. Be intentional to read the room and follow up with necessary outside of group.

- What would the people have needed do differently in order to trust Jesus?
- Do you generally trust people and how does that impact how you trust Jesus?
- Would Jesus say that you trust him? Why or why not?

Hands

People usually lack trust because of previous stress. Stress usually inhibits creativity. If discussion is slow you could brainstorm ideas as a group that could help anyone trust Jesus more. Be careful not to fix/rescue individuals with personal advice though.

- What would you need to do differently in order to trust Jesus more?
- Think of someone you know that doesn't trust Jesus. How could you help that person trust Jesus more?
- Pray for one another and for the faith to trust Jesus more.

Next Week

Be intentional to ask others to find a place to serve the group. Encourage group members to share the Bible story, pray at the beginning or end, bring a snack or drinks, take attendance or even lead the icebreaker, guidelines or discussion questions.
