Today's big idea: The good shepherd has a plan.

As people are sharing, if they are new or not very involved ask how they might like to be more involved.

- Talk about how you got connected with HFC and how you are involved now.
- Review the Community Group Guidelines together.
- What did you hear in the sermon that caught your attention?
- Someone pray that God would help us hear from him.

Head

Try Bible Storytelling this week. Others will be able to understand the illustration better through the story told than the story read.

- Use the Bible Storytelling technique to tell the story of Jesus the good shepherd.
- Retell the story together as a group.
- Read the story from John 10:7-18 in the Bible.
- What promises did Jesus make in these verses?
- Who is NOT the good shepherd and how are they described?

Heart

If you group is not being transparent and vulnerable you may need to model that for them. Be ready to lead the group deeper in conversation.

- How have you experienced the thief, the hired hand or the wolf recently?
- How has the church helped you hear the good shepherd as you were dealing with the thief, the hired hand and/or the wolf?

Hands

Make sure this is super practical. Not just good ideas, but what will you actually do?

- How can you hear and listen to the voice of the good shepherd especially under stress?
- How can you help others listen to the voice of the good shepherd?
- Pray for one another and thank God for all of his promises.
